Call to the Word Psalm 119:73-80

Your hands have made me and fashioned me; Give me understanding, that I may learn Your commandments. Those who fear You will be glad when they see me, Because I have hoped in Your word. (Ps 119:73-74)



I know, O LORD, that Your judgments *are* right, And *that* in faithfulness You have afflicted me. Let, I pray, Your merciful kindness be for my comfort, According to Your word to Your servant. (Ps 119:75-76)



Let Your tender mercies come to me, that I may live; For Your law *is* my delight. Let the proud be ashamed, For they treated me wrongfully with falsehood; But I will meditate on Your precepts. (Ps 119:77-78)

Let those who fear You turn to me, Those who know Your testimonies. Let my heart be blameless regarding Your statutes, That I may not be ashamed. (Ps 119:79-80)

introduction Prv 11:9-19

Contrasting Righteousness and Wickedness Proverbs 11:20-31

Perverse: one who has turned aside from God and has a distorted view of what is right.

Prv 6:14 ... perverted hearts plot evil and constantly stir up trouble.

Abomination: morally disgusting



The Blameless are His Delight



Join Forces: band together to resist God Gen 11:1-9

Time, progress, government, and organization have made man better off, but not better in character.



Discretion: The word is literally 'taste'; this can mean physical taste, intellectual discretion or ethical judgment.

Ex: Abigail of 1Sam 25




The good character of a **righteous** man or woman is reflected in their desires. They **desire** that which is good.

HOWEVER

The wicked can expect that which is due to them will come to them.



One who scatters: is one who shares of their own material possessions...





There is one who withholds more than is right...

Mat 10:8 ... Freely you have received, freely give.



"The soul of blessing - that man who is a blessing to others... will be made rich."

We are never the loser for our God-guided generosity. Jesus told us that it is more blessed to give than to receive



"God knows political economy, whether men do or not, and leaving the coarse machinery of police regulations, he puts the offender under a form of selfacting legislature which is far more efficient." (Spurgeon)



God honors the one who earnestly seeks good, and that one may be blessed with favor with God and among men. This is especially true when the good sought is God Himself.

Deut 4:29



Proverbs teaches us the value of money and wealth but also teaches us to never trust in riches. To put trust in riches is to invite our own fall.

"Riches were never true to any that trusted to them." (Trapp)



Example: Nabal, by selfishly hoarding his food and water for his own men, hung disaster over his household, but Abigail, by her wisdom, saved it . (1Sam 25:17,33)



Pro 11:31 if the righteous will be rewarded on the earth [*with godly blessings*], how much more [*will*] the wicked and the sinner [*be repaid with punishment*]!

1Pe 4:18 and if it is difficult for the righteous to be saved, what will become of the godless and the sinner?
