REVIEW

Verses 1-3: The announcement of Babylon's fall and the call for people to come out of her.

Verses 4-5: The warning to avoid participation in Babylon's sins and to not partake in her judgment.

REVIEW

Verses 6-7: A statement about Babylon's pride, luxury, and judgment coming swiftly.

First, self-indulgence (lived luxuriously).

Second, pride (glorified herself... sits as a queen).

Third, avoidance of suffering (am no widow, and will not see sorrow).

Verse 8: A declaration plagues will come all at once, bringing destruction and mourn

REV 18:9-10 THE LAMENT OF THE KINGS

Three times they cried out in deep anguish over Babylon's sudden and absolute destruction:

18:10, 18:16-17, 18:19

REV 18:.11-17 THE LAMENT OF THE MERCHANTS

Luxuries – not necessities

The Bible never outright condemns luxuries.

Php 4:12

REV 18:.11-17 THE LAMENT OF THE MERCHANTS

It's when luxuries become essential to life; they are viewed as the sole means of peace and source of security.

Luke 12:16-21

REV 18: 11-17 THE LAMENT OF THE MERCHANTS

"The combined picture is one of complete abandonment to the wealth of this world and complete disregard of the God who gave it."

(Walvoord)

Ultimately, hell will be a place of unfulfilled desire.

REV 18: 17-20 THE LAMENT OF THE SEA CAPTAINS

Ship captains will mourn the loss of Babylon and the lucrative transport business that went with it.

The lament will be over Babylon's destruction, not her sin.

Babylon is Left Desolate and Powerless

The ultimate reason for commercial Babylon's judgment: She has killed the prophets and saints.

One of the great mysteries of Christianity is contentment. What we must learn is that contentment is not something that's found; it is an attitude.

Contentment comes in knowing God's plan for your life, having a conviction to live it, and believing that God's peace is greater than the world's problems.
