A Day of Impossible Needs

**Faith Comes to Jesus:
Jairus & the Bleeding Woman**

Mk 5:22–34; Mt 9:18–22

God is not stingy with His presence. The Jesus who stepped off that boat and walked with Jairus is the same Jesus who says to you, "I'll go with you into *that* situation too."

Faith is coming to Jesus, Himself, convinced He is able, acting on that conviction even when it feels too late, receiving His work as grace, and refusing to quit or grow cynical.

Jesus loves you too much for that.

**His goodness isn't just to make you *functional*,
it's to make you *family*.**

When Faith Is Tested: Delay, Death, and “Do You Believe I Am Able?”

(Mk 5:35–43; Mt 9:27–31)

Faith that pleases God isn't faith that never hears bad news; it's faith that clings to Jesus when the bad news lands. It's hearing Him say to you in your moment, "Don't be afraid. Keep trusting Me," and choosing to stick with Him even when you don't understand what He's doing.

The Blind Men – Faith answers:

“Yes, Lord, You are able”

Matthew 9:27-31

Faith is coming to Jesus, Himself, convinced He is able, acting on that conviction even when it feels too late, receiving His work as grace, and refusing to quit or grow cynical.

Faith for Others: Bringing the Bound to Jesus
(Mt 9:32–33)

That's the goodness of God to the helpless.
He honors the faith of the ones who bring, and He frees
the one who *can't even ask* for himself.
He turns muteness into testimony.
